Essentials

- > Designated editors at member newspapers can upload copy to State News Exchange.
- > Member material is visible in the AP Exchange Web-browser
- > Content is linked thematically with AP stories, photos, video and graphics, as well as material from third party providers accessible to the paper
- > State News Exchange will allow a newspaper to correct or kill a story or photo as required
- > Members will be legally responsible for news moved into the news exchange
- > AP Editors will continue to select, edit and distribute stories and photos from member papers.
